What is this product?

Type | Mandarine Unique small & mid caps Europe is a sub-fund of a SICAV (Société d'Investissement à Capital Variable) under Luxembourg law. Each shareholder has a right of co-ownership in the assets of the SICAV in proportion to the number of shares held.

Duration | The UCI was created in 29/03/2010 and has an expected lifetime of 99 years.

Objectives | Mandarine Unique Small & Mid Caps Europe (the "Fund") is a European equity fund mainly invested in small and mid caps with significant growth potential.

The objective of the Fund, managed in a discretionary manner, is to outperform its benchmark index, the Small Stoxx 200 index (dividends reinvested), over the recommended investment period of five years. However, the Fund's objective is not to replicate the performance of this index in any way.

The Fund shall invest at least 75% of its net assets in companies which have their registered offices located within the EEA.

As part of the aforementioned framework, the Fund will employ a financial strategy consisting of selecting companies with a unique character by applying a qualitative filter based on uniqueness criteria: unique business models (no listed competitor in Europe), global leaders (with significant market share), companies with a distinct technology or geographical exposure, which generate sustainable and profitable growth based on several drivers. These companies therefore often benefit from pricing power, enabling them to be less affected by the economic situation. The result of identifying these unique companies, which are highly diversified from a sectoral perspective, is less volatility.

The Fund benefits from a non-financial rating of the issuers in its investment universe. The construction of this rating is based on the proprietary ESG-View system, which is based on 4 pillars: Environment (E), Social (S), Governance (G) and Stakeholders (SH). The analysis of the non-financial indicators that make up the pillars results in a score ("ESG-View Score") for each pillar, ranging from -2 to +2. Unmonitored and/or unrated issuers are not included in the composition of the Analysed Universe. All the securities in the defined universe are analysed using extra-financial criteria defined by the Management Company's in-house SRI analysis team. In accordance with the SRI Label guidelines, the Fund excludes issuers in the

fossil fuel sector, companies that contravene international standards, those involved in the production of tobacco, controversial weapons and coal. Finally, the sub-fund will exclude issuers with the lowest ESG-View rating (on a scale of -2 to 2, 2 being the best) in order to achieve an exclusion rate of at least 25% of the Analysed Universe and 30% from 1 January 2026, in terms of number of issuers or weight.

As part of its cash flow management, the Fund may also invest up to 25% of its assets in debt securities and money market instruments. Financial futures instruments may be used for hedging or exposure purposes. The Fund may invest up to 10% of its net assets in UCI units.

Management objective: To achieve a higher return than that of its benchmark index.

The Fund takes sustainability risks and ESG characteristics into account in its selection process. In this regard, the Fund promotes environmental or social characteristics within the meaning of Article 8 of the SFDR Regulation. The Fund is subject to a sustainability risk as defined in the risk profile of the prospectus.

What are the risks and what could I receive in return?

Risk indicator



The risk indicator assumes that you hold the units for five years.

Please note: The actual risk may be very different if you opt for an early exit, and you may receive less in return.

The synthetic risk indicator makes it possible to assess the level of risk of this product in relation to other products. It indicates the likelihood of this product incurring losses in the event of market movements or our inability to pay you.

We have classified the product in risk class 4 out of 7, which is a medium risk class. This means that the potential losses associated with the future performance of the product are in the medium range and, should the situation on the financial markets deteriorate, it is possible that our ability to pay you will be affected.

Discretionary management risk | The management style is based on anticipating various market trends; there is a risk that the Fund may not be invested in the best-performing markets at any particular time.

Credit risk | It represents the potential risk of a sudden deterioration in the quality of an issuer or its default.

Liquidity risk | It represents the drop in price that the Fund would potentially have to accept in order to sell certain assets for which there is insufficient demand on the market.

Guarantee | The Fund's capital is not guaranteed.

What happens if Mandarine Gestion is unable to make payments?

Mandarine Gestion is a portfolio management company approved and monitored by the Financial Markets Authority (Autorité des Marchés Financiers) and must comply with organisational and operational rules, particularly with regard to equity. The investor's funds or the income of the UCI are paid into one or more bank accounts opened in the name of the UCI. Consequently, the default of Mandarine Gestion would not have an impact on the assets of the UCI. The UCI does not benefit from a compensation scheme.

How much will this investment cost me?

- that in the first year you would get back the amount you invested (0% annual return). that for the other holding periods, the product evolves as indicated in the intermediate scenario.

How long do I have to keep it and can I withdraw money early?

You can redeem your shares daily, redemption transactions are executed daily. Holding for less than the recommended period is likely to penalise the investor.
