Jupiter Asset Management Series plc

An umbrella type open-ended investment company with variable capital and segregated liability between sub-funds and incorporated with limited liability under the laws of Ireland with registered number 271517, authorised by the Central Bank on 10 October 1997 as a UCITS, pursuant to the UCITS Regulations.

This Supplement contains information relating specifically to the Jupiter Merian Global Equity Absolute Return Fund (the "Fund"), a sub-fund of Jupiter Asset Management Series plc (the "Company"), an openended umbrella fund with segregated liability between sub-funds.

This Supplement forms part of and should be read in the context of and in conjunction with the Prospectus for the Company dated 18 June 2025 (the "Prospectus").

Jupiter Merian Global Equity Absolute Return Fund

Capitalised terms used herein shall have the meanings attributed to them in the Prospectus.

The Directors of the Company whose names appear in the Prospectus under the heading "Management and Administration" accept responsibility for the information contained in this Supplement and the Prospectus. To the best of the knowledge and belief of the Directors (who have taken all reasonable care to ensure that such is the case) the information contained in this Supplement and in the Prospectus is in accordance with the facts and does not omit anything likely to affect the import of such information. The Directors accept responsibility accordingly.

Investment in the Fund is not in the nature of a deposit in a bank account and is not protected by any government, government agency or other guarantee scheme which may be available to protect the holder of a bank deposit account.

Due to the higher than average degree of risk because of its ability to invest in financial derivative instruments for investment purposes which may increase the volatility of the Fund, an investment in the Fund should not constitute a substantial proportion of an investment portfolio and may not be appropriate for all investors.

Investment Objective and Policies

The objective of the Fund is capital appreciation while closely controlling risk. In addition, the Fund intends to deliver absolute returns that have a low correlation with equity and bond markets.

The Fund aims to achieve its investment objective by investing primarily in a portfolio of equity securities of companies located worldwide and listed or traded on Regulated Markets and by pursuing the strategy detailed below. It is not proposed to concentrate investments in any one geographical region or sector.

The Fund aims to deliver an absolute return over rolling 12 month periods, in other words, at any one time the portfolio of the Fund will typically be constructed with reference to an investment horizon of no greater than 12 months.

The Fund will be structured as a market neutral portfolio. A universe of major market, large capitalisation global equity stocks will be assessed, and long positions taken in the stocks determined most likely to deliver a positive relative return, and short positions taken in the stocks determined most likely to deliver a negative relative return. The total value of the long positions will be approximately matched by the total value of the short positions. Under normal market conditions and depending on the shorting opportunities in the markets, the Investment Manager expects that the Fund's short exposure will normally be less than 125% of Net Asset Value. Under normal market conditions, the Investment Manager expects that the Fund's long exposure will not normally exceed 125% of Net Asset Value. Accordingly, under normal market conditions the Fund's net exposure to investment markets is likely to be in the range of –5% to +5% of Net Asset Value.

The Fund may also invest in equity-related securities such as preferred stocks, convertible bonds (usually unrated), American and Global Depository Receipts, and collective investment schemes (including money market funds) which comply with the Central Bank's requirements. Investment in other collective investment schemes will not exceed 10%.

The Fund may invest in and have direct access to certain eligible China A Shares listed on the Shanghai Stock Exchange and Shenzhen Stock Exchange via the Shanghai-Hong Kong Stock Connect (as further described in the sub-section headed "Shanghai-Hong Kong Stock Connect" below) and the Shenzhen-Hong Kong Stock Connect (as further described in the sub-section headed "Shenzhen-Hong Kong Stock Connect" below) (collectively, the "Stock Connects"). Exposure to China A Shares through the Stock Connects will not be more than 10% of the Fund's Net Asset Value.

Not less than **51%** of the Net Asset Value of the Fund will be invested directly in equities and equity related securities.

The Investment Manager will also use derivatives for investment purposes including contracts for difference, index options and equity related futures. A description of derivative instruments and their commercial purposes is set out under the heading "Financial Derivative Instruments" in the Prospectus. The Fund may be leveraged through the use of derivatives which may result in the Net Asset Value of Fund having a high volatility. The extent of this leverage is not expected to exceed 250% of the Net Asset Value of the Fund though there is the possibility of higher leverage levels.*

*The 250% leverage is calculated as the sum of the notional value of the Fund's long positions and the absolute notional value of Fund's synthetic short positions, with no differentiation made as to whether instruments are used for investment or hedging purposes and no netting, even in respect of underlying positions, is allowed. Synthetic short positions are positions which are in economic terms equivalent to short positions and will be implemented through the use of financial derivative instruments in accordance with the Central Bank's requirements.

As the Fund will use an absolute VaR model to measure the global market risk, the VaR limit for Fund cannot be greater than 4.47% of the Net Asset Value of the Fund. The VaR for the Fund will be calculated daily using a one-tailed 99% confidence level, a one day holding period and the historical period will not be less than one year (250 Business Days) and quarterly data set updates, or more frequent when market prices are subject to material changes.

From time to time a substantial portion or all of the assets of the Fund may be held in cash deposits, investment grade treasury bills or short-term money market instruments as understood by reference to the UCITS Regulations and in money market funds (subject to the aggregate limit of 10% in collective investment schemes) ("**Liquid Assets**"). Investment to such extent in Liquid Assets may be made where this is considered to be in the best interests of Shareholders of the Sub-Fund; for example, to mitigate Fund's exposure to market risk. The Fund will not invest in below Investment Grade debt securities.

Stock selection focuses primarily on liquid equities listed on Regulated Markets. The Fund is diversified across a range of industries and stocks. Limits are employed in terms of position size. Net market exposure is maintained at a minimum level. Gross market exposure of the Fund is maintained within predetermined limits. Position sizes and market exposure are monitored regularly by the Investment Manager.

The Fund is denominated in US Dollars.

Investment Approach

The Fund is actively managed, which means the Investment Manager has freedom to select the investments in order to seek to achieve the investment objective of the Fund. The Investment Manager does not manage the Fund to, or control the Fund's risk relative to, any market index.

In seeking to achieve its investment objective, the Fund will aim to deliver a return, net of fees, in excess of the Federal Reserve Funds Target Rate over rolling 3 year periods. For performance measurement purposes, the cash benchmark will differ for non-base currency classes.

The Federal Reserve Funds Target Rate is the interest rate target for US financial institutions borrowing and lending to one another on an unsecured overnight basis. It is set by the central bank of the United States; the Federal Reserve.

The Investment Manager seeks to exploit market inefficiencies by employing quantitative research, based on fundamental investment insights and objective evidence, to identify "return factors" that predict stock price movements. This uses sophisticated computer models to analyse large volumes of data to select investments. Stocks are assessed in terms of the attractiveness of their valuation, quality, price trends, stable growth prospects, sentiment and company management. In addition, the Investment Manager takes other criteria, such as expected risk, trading costs and liquidity into consideration when constructing the Fund's portfolio. The investment process focuses equally on risk and return and aims to generate a highly diversified market neutral portfolio with favourable risk return characteristics, selecting long and short positions (through the use of derivatives where appropriate or required) from major global equity markets.

Sustainability Approach

Fund promotes environmental and social characteristics on an ongoing basis within the scope of Article 8 of SFDR but does not have a sustainable investment objective. The environmental and social characteristics promoted by the Fund are: (i) the promotion of portfolio carbon efficiency; and (ii) the upholding responsibilities to people and planet in seeking compliance with the UN Global Compact Principles. Such environmental and social characteristics may develop over time.

Further information about the environmental and social characteristics promoted by Fund is available in the pre-contractual disclosures relating to Fund set out in the Annex hereto.

A minimum of 90% of Fund's investments will be analysed using the Investment Manager's ESG characteristics.

Material sustainability risks are integrated into the portfolio construction and rebalancing processes. The active ownership approach considers material environmental and social factors and principal adverse impacts on sustainability factors which strengthen the assessment of the risks and opportunities that drive long-term value.

The Investment Manager incorporates an explicit ESG factor into portfolio construction, rebalancing and analysis alongside all other datapoints. The ESG factor is obtained by using independent third-party data. Analysis is conducted on the ranking of specific issuer and time series data on ESG scores. This information is embedded in the process and is linked to the assessment of stock returns and forecasts.

The Investment Manager has ultimate responsibility for the integration of sustainability risks within the portfolio construction and rebalancing processes.

Please refer to the sections of the Prospectus headed "Environmental, Social and Governance ("ESG") Investment Risk", "Sustainability Risk" and "The Sustainable Finance Disclosure Regulation" for further information.

Stock Connects

The Fund may invest in certain eligible China A Shares through the Stock Connects. The Shanghai-Hong Kong Stock Connect is a securities trading and clearing links program developed by Hong Kong Exchanges and Clearing Limited ("HKEx"), Shanghai Stock Exchange ("SSE") and China Securities Depository and Clearing Corporation Limited ("ChinaClear"). The Shenzhen-Hong Kong Stock Connect is a securities trading and clearing links program developed by the HKEx, the Shenzhen Stock Exchange ("SZSE") and ChinaClear. The aim of the Stock Connects is to achieve mutual stock market access between mainland China and Hong Kong.

The Shanghai-Hong Kong Stock Connect comprises a Northbound Shanghai Trading Link and a Southbound Hong Kong Trading Link. Under the Northbound Shanghai Trading Link, Hong Kong and overseas investors (including the Fund), through their Hong Kong brokers, sub-custodians and a securities trading service company established by the Stock Exchange of Hong Kong ("SEHK"), may be able to trade eligible China A Shares listed on the SSE ("SSE securities") by routing orders to SSE. Under the Southbound Hong Kong Trading Link under Shanghai-Hong Kong Stock Connect, investors in the PRC will be able to trade certain stocks listed on the SEHK.

The Shenzhen-Hong Kong Stock Connect comprises a Northbound Shenzhen Trading Link and a Southbound Hong Kong Trading Link. Under the Northbound Shenzhen Trading Link, Hong Kong and overseas investors (including the Fund), through their Hong Kong brokers, sub-custodians and a securities trading service company established by SEHK, may be able to trade eligible China A Shares listed on the SZSE ("SZSE securities") by routing orders to SZSE. Under the Southbound Hong Kong Trading Link under Shenzhen-Hong Kong Stock Connect, investors in the PRC will be able to trade certain stocks listed on the SEHK.

Eligible Securities

(i) The Shanghai-Hong Kong Stock Connect

Under the Shanghai-Hong Kong Stock Connect, the Fund, through the Hong Kong brokers, may trade certain eligible SSE securities. The eligible securities include (i) the constituent stocks of the SSE A Share Index that fulfil all of the relevant criteria at any half-yearly review, monthly review or DVR Stock¹ review, as the case may be; and (ii) the SSE-listed China A Shares that are not accepted for Northbound trading by virtue of (i) above but which have corresponding H-Shares accepted for listing and trading on the SEHK, provided that:

- (b) they are not traded on the SSE in currencies other than RMB; and
- (c) they are not under risk alert.

It is expected that the list of eligible securities will be subject to review and may change.

Investors eligible to trade shares that are listed on the Science and Technology Innovation Board of SSE under Northbound trading are limited to institutional professional investors.

(ii) The Shenzhen-Hong Kong Stock Connect

Under the Shenzhen-Hong Kong Stock Connect, the Fund, through the Hong Kong brokers, may trade certain eligible SZSE securities. The eligible securities include (i) SZSE-listed China A Shares that are constituent stocks of the SZSE Composite Index and fulfil all of the relevant criteria at any half-yearly review, monthly review or DVR Stock¹ review, as the case may be;and (ii) the SZSE-listed China A shares that are not accepted for Northbound trading by virtue of (i) above but which have corresponding H-Shares accepted for listing and trading on the SEHK,provided that:

- a) they are not traded on the SZSE in currencies other than RMB; and
- b) they are not under risk alert.

Investors eligible to trade shares that are listed on the ChiNext Board of SZSE under the Northbound Shenzhen Trading Link are limited to institutional professional investors as defined in the relevant Hong Kong rules and regulations.

It is expected that the list of eligible securities will be subject to review and may change.

The term "China A Shares" means domestic shares in the PRC incorporated companies listed on either the SSE or the Shenzhen Stock Exchange, the prices of which are quoted in RMB and which are available to such investors as approved by the China Securities Regulatory Commission.

In addition to those risk factors set out in relation to the PRC investment, a number of the key risks of investing in selective China A Shares listed on the SSE or the SZSE via the Stock Connects are set out in the section of the Prospectus entitled "**Risk Factors**".

Profile of a Typical Investor

A typical investor has a long term investment horizon and is prepared to accept a moderate level of volatility. This is not a guide to the future volatility of the Fund and may move over time. Investors may also refer to the KIID and/or PRIIPs KID for the most up-to-date SRRI or SRI measurement of volatility.

Initial Offer Period and Subscription Price

The Initial Offer Period for any Share Class in the Fund which is available but not yet launched will close on 18 December 2025. The Initial Offer Period in respect of any new Share Class may be shortened or extended by the Directors. The Central Bank will be notified in advance of any such extension if subscriptions for Shares have been received and otherwise on an annual basis. After closing of the Initial Offer Period Shares in the Fund will be issued at the Net Asset Value per Share.

The initial subscription price of each Share Class during the Initial Offer Period shall be, depending on the denomination of the Share Class, AUD 10.00, CHF 10.00, EUR 10.00, GBP 10.00, JPY 1,000.00, RMB 10.00, SEK 10.00, SGD 10.00, USD 10.00.

Notwithstanding the foregoing disclosure in the Prospectus, the Manager or the Investment Manager will directly discharge the proportion of all Annual Expenses (as defined below) charged to Class I2 Shares.

For the purpose of this section, "Annual Expenses" means all fees, costs and expenses connected with the establishment, management and operation of the Company and the Fund. Such fees, costs and expenses include, but are not limited to (i) the fees and expenses (including out-of-pocket expenses) of the service providers to the Company and Fund, including the Depositary and the Administrator; (ii) Directors fees and out-of-pocket expenses; and (iii) operational expenses, to the extent that such expenses are not excluded as set out below.

"Annual Expenses" shall not, however, include (i) the fees and expenses of the Manager and its out-of-pocket expenses; (ii) any taxation (including stamp duty) to which the Company or the Fund may be liable; (iii) exchange fees; (iv) commissions; (v) brokerage fees; (vi) settlement and clearing fees; (vii) other expenses incurred with respect to the Fund's investments and; (viii) any extraordinary or exceptional costs and expenses as may arise from time to time such as material litigation in relation to the Company or the Fund. The foregoing fees, costs and expenses, where arising, will be borne by the Company or the Fund, as applicable.

For further details on the subscription, repurchase, transfer or conversion of Shares in the Fund please refer to the section of the Prospectus headed "**Subscriptions**, **Repurchases and Dealings in Shares**".

Performance Fee

The Performance Fee is applicable to all Share Classes with the exception of: Class L (CHF) Hedged Accumulation Shares, Class X (GBP) Hedged Accumulation Shares and Class I2 Shares.

The Performance Fee accrues and is taken into account in the calculation of the Net Asset Value per Share on a daily basis.

Performance Fees are payable on net realised and net unrealised gains and losses as at the end of each Performance Period of the Fund and as a result, Performance Fees may be paid on unrealised gains which may subsequently never be realised.

Performance Fees may be payable on net realised and net unrealised gains and losses attributable to both the performance of the Investment Manager and market movements in general.

The Performance Fees are calculated with reference to an adjusted average number of Shares in issue during the relevant Performance Period. The Performance Fee as at the end of each Performance Period of the Fund shall be equal in aggregate to 20% of the amount by which any increase in the Net Asset Value per Share of each Class during the Performance Period of the Fund exceeds the Hurdle Rate (as defined below), subject to the Net Asset Value High Water Mark (as defined below), multiplied by the adjusted average number of total Shares in issue of each Class on each Dealing Day during the Performance Period of the Fund. The adjusted average number of Shares takes account of repurchases, conversions and subscriptions occurring during the relevant Performance Period.

The relevant "Hurdle Rate" will be the average of:

- (1) Bank of England Base Rate for the GBP Share Classes,
- (2) ECB Main Refinancing Operations Rate for the EUR Share Classes,
- (3) Federal Reserve Funds Target Rate for the USD Share Classes,
- (4) Swiss Average Overnight Rate for the CHF Share Classes*,
- (5) Riksbank Repo rate for the SEK Share Classes,
- (6) Singapore Overnight Rate Average for the SGD Share Classes, and
- (7) People's Bank of China one-year loan prime rate for the RMB Share Classes,

as applicable, for the relevant Share Class currency during the Performance Period of the Fund.

As outlined in the 'Investment Approach' section above, the relevant Hurdle Rate is also used as a cash benchmark for performance measurement purposes. Information on the Fund's past performance measured against the cash benchmark is included in the relevant KIID and/or PRIIPs KID.

The Performance Fee is only payable when the increase in the Net Asset Value of each Class exceeds the Hurdle Rate accrued during the relevant Performance Period.

All Performance Fee payments shall be subject to the restriction that in paying a Performance Fee, the Net Asset Value per Share of each Class at the relevant Performance Period of the Fund shall not be less than the Net Asset Value per Share Class on the last day that a Performance Fee was paid (the "Net Asset Value High Water Mark"). The Performance Fee is only payable on the increase in the Net Asset Value per Share of each Class during the Performance Period of the Fund over the Net Asset Value High Water Mark and the relevant Hurdle Rate during the Performance Period of the Fund. If, during a performance fee period, the performance of the Shares does not exceed the Hurdle Rate, no Performance Fee is payable.

The Performance Fees applicable to the Fund detailed above should be read in conjunction with the detailed summary of each of the fees and expenses of the Fund and the Company set out in the section of the Prospectus headed "Fees and Expenses".

Performance Fee Calculation Breakdown

The Investment Manager will be entitled to a Performance Fee in respect of the relevant Classes. The following examples are included for information purposes only and are not intended to reflect any actual past performance or potential future performance. This example assumes that an investment of \$100,000 is made on the first day of the calendar year in one of the relevant Performance Fee Classes, which attracts a Performance Fee of 20%. The initial NAV per Share is calculated as \$10 (the initial High-Water Mark), and the number of shares remain unchanged.

Year 1 Class outperforms the Net Asset Value High Water Mark (has positive absolute performance) but not the Hurdle Rate (i.e please see "Out/ Underperformance" in the table above). No Performance Fee payable;

Year 2 Class goes from underperforming the Hurdle Rate to outperforming it (i.e. the class has outperformed the Hurdle Rate, please see "Out/ Underperformance" in the table above); while also remaining above the Net Asset Value High Water Mark. Total Return Swaps

Jupiter Merian Global Equity Absolute Return Fund (the "Fund") meets the criteria pursuant to Article 8 of the SFDR to qualify as a financial product which promotes, among other characteristics, environmental or social characteristics, or a combination of those characteristics and provided that the companies that the Fund invests in follow good governance practices.

This Annex has been prepared for the purpose of meeting the specific financial productlevel disclosure requirements contained in the SFDR applicable to an Article 8 financial product.

What environmental and/or social characteristics are promoted by this financial product?

The environmental and social characteristics promoted by the Fund are: (i) the promotion of portfolio carbon efficiency; and (ii) the upholding responsibilities to people and planet in seeking compliance with the UN Global Compact Principles. Such environmental and social characteristics may develop over time. The Fund has not designated a reference benchmark for the purpose of attaining the environmental and social characteristics promoted by the Fund.

Environmental characteristic

The environmental characteristic promoted by the Fund is the promotion of portfolio carbon efficiency. The Fund measures the attainment of this characteristic through seeking to invest in a portfolio of investments that has, on a net basis, a level of carbon emissions intensity that is lower than zero (determined based on the weighted average carbon emissions intensity of the Fund's holdings).

The monitoring and evaluation of companies' carbon emissions intensity is factored into the Fund's portfolio construction and rebalancing processes.

There may be times when the portfolio of investments has, on a net basis, a level of carbon emissions intensity that is higher than zero. This can be attributed to the rebalancing process further to the Fund's global investment focus.

Social characteristic

The social characteristic promoted by the Fund is upholding responsibilities to people and planet, which is defined as seeking compliance with the UN Global Compact Principles. The UN Global Compact Principles are a voluntary initiative based on CEO commitments to implement universal sustainability principles and to take steps to support UN goals.

The Fund measures the attainment of this characteristic through the monitoring and evaluation of companies against the UN Global Compact Principles (particularly any involvement in violations of one or more of the 10 principles). This is factored into the Fund's portfolio construction and rebalancing processes. Where an investee company has been identified by the Investment Manager as being in breach of the UN Global Compact Principles, this holding will be considered to be not aligned with the upholding of responsibilities to people and planet.

What investment strategy does this financial product follow?

The Fund is managed by the Investment Manager adopting a "systematic" investment process, which uses sophisticated computer models to analyse large volumes of data to select investments. Stocks are assessed in terms of the attractiveness of their valuation, quality, price trends, stable growth prospects, environmental and social characteristics, sentiment and company management. In addition, the Investment Manager takes other criteria, such as expected risk, trading costs and liquidity into consideration when constructing the Fund's portfolio.

Sustainability risks (defined in SFDR as an environmental, social or governance event or condition that, if it occurs, could cause a negative material impact on the value of the investment) are integrated into the Fund's portfolio construction and rebalancing processes.

The Fund will exclude investments in companies that derive revenues from specific controversial business activities as described in detail below.

The investment strategy guides investment decisions based on factors such as investment objectives and risk tolerance.

What are the binding elements of the investment strategy used to select the investments to attain each of the environmental or social characteristics promoted by this financial product?

The Investment Manager excludes investment in any company that:

- derives revenues from anti-personnel mines (0% revenue threshold);
- derives revenues from biological weapons (0% revenue threshold);
- derives revenues from chemical weapons (0% revenue threshold);
- derives revenues from cluster munitions (0% revenue threshold);
- derives revenues from depleted uranium weapons (0% revenue threshold);
- derives revenues from non-detectable fragments, incendiary weapons and blinding laser weapons (0% revenue threshold);
- derives revenues from nuclear weapons (0% revenue threshold);
- produces tobacco and/or tobacco products (0% revenue threshold);
- in relation to long positions held by the Fund only, derives revenues from thermal coal extraction or from thermal coal-based power generation (max. 25% revenue threshold).

These exclusions are binding elements and are embedded into the Fund's portfolio construction and rebalancing processes.

The Fund's portfolio construction and rebalancing process shall provide that the Fund's portfolio of investments shall have, on a net basis, a level of carbon emissions intensity that is lower than zero (determined based on the weighted average carbon emissions intensity of the Fund's holdings). There may be times when the portfolio of investments has, on a net basis, a level of carbon emissions intensity that is higher than zero. This can be attributed to the rebalancing process further to the Fund's global investment focus.

What is the committed minimum rate to reduce the scope of the investments considered prior to the application of that investment strategy?

Good governance practices include sound management structures, employee relations, remuneration of staff and tax compliance.

What is the policy to assess good governance practices of the investee companies?

The Investment Manager uses a combination of the following to assess good governance practices of investee companies:

- the Fund's quantitative ESG factor integration model which will:
 - in relation to the long positions held by the Fund, tilt the portfolio towards companies with better governance practices and away from companies with lower governance scores; and
 - in relation to the short positions held by the Fund, tilt the portfolio away from companies with better governance practices and toward companies with lower governance scores, and
- using independent third-party data to:
 - screen the universe and will exclude companies which fail to meet a certain threshold determined by the Investment Manager to represent the minimum level for good governance. In the event that a position already held by the Fund fails to meet such threshold, it would be closed under the Fund's regular rebalancing process; and
 - monitor all portfolio companies for UNGC compliance. This scrutiny is aligned to the principles of good governance concerning labour rights and business ethics..



What is the asset allocation planned for this financial product?

The minimum share of investments aligned with the social characteristic promoted by the Fund, based on currently available data and estimates is 35%.

When determining the minimum share of investments aligned with the social characteristic promoted by the Fund:

- 1) relevant net long derivative positions are considered to align with the social characteristic promoted by the Fund;
- 2) all net short positions are not considered irrespective of whether they align with the social characteristic promoted by the Fund; and
- transactions entered into solely for currency hedging purposes are excluded (i.e. they
 are not factored into the minimum share of investments figure or into the value of the
 overall portfolio).

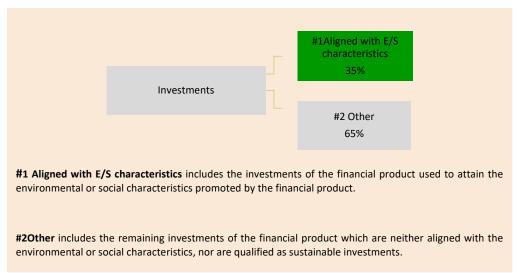
If net short positions aligned with the social characteristic promoted by the Fund were to be considered, the minimum share of investments aligned with the social characteristic promoted by the Fund would increase from 35% to 70%.

The remaining portion of the Fund's investment portfolio ("#2Other") will consist of investments which are not aligned to the social characteristic promoted by the Fund, investments for which relevant data is not available and/or cash and cash equivalents held on an ancillary basis.

The environmental characteristic promoted by the Fund (portfolio carbon efficiency) is measured through seeking to invest in a portfolio of investments that has, on a net basis, a level of carbon emissions intensity that is lower than zero. The level of carbon emissions intensity of the Fund's portfolio is determined based on the weighted average carbon emissions intensity of all of the Fund's holdings as opposed to on the basis of a minimum share of assets aligned with the environmental characteristic. There may be times when the portfolio of investments has, on a net basis, a level of carbon emissions intensity that

is higher than zero. This can be attributed to the rebalancing process further to the Fund's global investment focus.



How does the use of derivatives attain the environmental or social characteristics promoted by the financial product?

The Fund may use net long derivative instruments for the purpose of attaining the environmental and/or social characteristics it promotes.

The underlying companies of these derivative positions will align with the social characteristic promoted by the Fund. Net short positions are not considered, irrespective of whether they align with the social characteristic promoted by the Fund.

In relation to the promotion of the environmental characteristic, derivatives allow the Fund to achieve short exposure to companies with the level of carbon emissions intensity of the Fund's portfolio determined based on the net weighted average carbon emissions intensity of all of the Fund's holdings. Subject to the previously outlined provisions on the rebalancing process of the Fund and its global investment focus, the weighted average carbon emissions intensity of the short investments must therefore be higher than the weighted average carbon emissions intensity of the long positions, resulting in a net weighted average carbon emissions intensity that is less than zero.



To what minimum extent are sustainable investments with an environmental objective aligned with the EU Taxonomy?

The minimum commitment to sustainable investments with an environmental objective aligned with the EU Taxonomy is 0%.

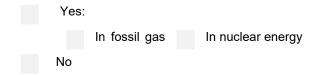

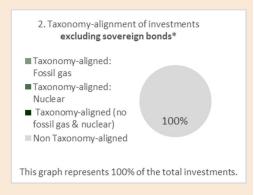
Transitional activities are activities for which low-carbon alternatives are not yet available and among others have greenhouse gas emission levels corresponding to the best performance.
